The Department of Chemistry invites applications for a tenure track position as Assistant or Associate Professor, beginning September 2010. Candidates will have a PhD and demonstrated excellence and postdoctoral experience in an aspect of chemistry relevant to chemical sensors and/or biosensors. The successful candidate would be expected to develop an independent externally funded research program as well as interact with faculty involved with sensors research. The Center includes the Computation and Measurements Facility, a state-of-the-art facility established by the State of Ohio for constructing and studying chemical sensors and biosensors. The Center is a founding member of the Ohio Wright Center of Innovation in Sensors and the McMicken College of Arts & Sciences Geographic Information Networks Research Cluster. The successful candidate will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses in the appropriate division of the Chemistry Department and participate in expected service opportunities.
